He is a practicing advocate and has been handling commercial and constitutional litigation for over 30 years in the Supreme Court of India and High Courts across the country.

He was born in 1961 into a family of lawyers in Kolkata. His father, Dipankar Prasad Gupta was the Solicitor General of India and a Vice President of the Bar Association of India and Country Counsellor for India in Lawasia.

After obtaining a first class in Economics from the University in Kolkata in 1981, he read for the Law Tripos in the University of Cambridge and then qualified for the English Bar from Lincoln's Inn in 1985. After completing his education, he started practicing in the High Court of Kolkata and subsequently in the Supreme Court of India. Mr. Gupta worked in the chambers of Sri K.K. Venugopal, Senior Advocate and noted jurist and currently the Attorney General of India. He was designated a Senior Advocate (the Indian equivalent of QC) in 2002. He frequently appeared before international and domestic arbitral and other tribunals.

He has been a regular participant and speaker at the Commonwealth Law Conference since 2011, at the Cambridge Symposium on Economic Crime since 2013 and other international conferences. Mr. Gupta co-authored the Arbitration section of Halsbury Laws of India and have contributed articles to several legal journals. He has been an accredited Advocacy Trainer with 16 years' experience. He has been actively participating in events organized by the Bar Association of India, Lawasia, UIA, and IBA for several years. He is currently a Vice President of the Bar Association of India.
